

Welcome to Granite Mountain Preserve

Granite Mountain Preserve is a 400+ acre assemblage of land owned by the Hudson Highlands Land Trust (HHLT). Our goal for the Preserve is to protect wildlife habitat and drinking water, while also serving as a recreational resource for the community. The Preserve is open from dawn to dusk for many types of non-motorized public recreation.

The following outlines some of the permitted and prohibited uses at the Preserve:*

Hiking is permitted from dawn to dusk. Users must remain on established, marked trails.	Motorized vehicles are prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, motorbikes, ATVs, and snowmobiles.
Dogs on leash are permitted. Dogs must remain under control of their owners. All pet waste must be packed out.	Collection of plants, wildlife, minerals, and historical/cultural artifacts by the public is prohibited.
Horseback riding is permitted. Note that there are no equestrian / trailer parking areas at the Preserve.	Trapping, swimming, dumping, and rock climbing are all prohibited.
Fishing consistent with state law is permitted.	Mountain bikes are prohibited.
Hunting / firearms, camping, and creation of campfires are all prohibited <u>EXCEPT</u> with the	

express prior written permission of the Hudson Highlands Land Trust.
