



Welcome to Granite Mountain Preserve

Granite Mountain Preserve is a 400+ acre assemblage of land owned by the Hudson Highlands Land Trust (HHLT). Our goal for the Preserve is to protect wildlife habitat and drinking water, while also serving as a recreational resource for the community. The Preserve is open from dawn to dusk for many types of non-motorized public recreation.

The following outlines some of the permitted and prohibited uses at the Preserve:*

<p>Hiking is permitted from dawn to dusk. Users must remain on established, marked trails.</p> <p>Dogs on leash are permitted. Dogs must remain under control of their owners. All pet waste must be packed out.</p> <p>Horseback riding is permitted. Note that there are no equestrian / trailer parking areas at the Preserve.</p> <p>Fishing consistent with state law is permitted.</p>	<p>Motorized vehicles are prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, motorbikes, ATVs, and snowmobiles.</p> <p>Collection of plants, wildlife, minerals, and historical/cultural artifacts by the public is prohibited.</p> <p>Trapping, swimming, dumping, and rock climbing are all prohibited.</p> <p>Mountain bikes are prohibited.</p>
<p>Hunting / firearms, camping, and creation of campfires are all prohibited EXCEPT with the express prior written permission of the Hudson Highlands Land Trust.</p>
